The war in Ukraine has been in the news for over three months with no end in sight. Millions of refugees have gone to neighboring countries to flee the war and millions remain in the country that are trying to survive.

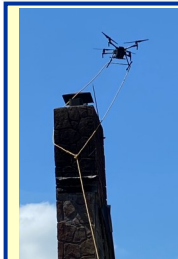
Church Compensation Survey 2022

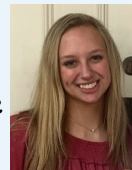
