The 196th Annual Meeting of the Nolachucky Baptist Association was held on Tuesday, October 17 at Morningside Baptist Church, Morristown. Thank you, Morningside, for being a wonderful host. Attending the meeting were 155 registered messengers from 42 churches. There were 28 pastors in attendance along with 28 registered guests. The estimated total attendance to the 2023 Annual Meeting was over 300.



Gene North led the worship with beautiful songs from the choir and the congregation. Special music was presented by a group of very talented young men who brought the crowd to their feet.



Rev. Benny Jones brought the message from Philippians 4:19 and encouraged everyone to plant seed and to spread the gospel. He referred to verse 19, "But my God shall supply all your need according to his riches in glory by Christ Jesus." He noted that everyone's greatest need is Jesus. He ended with prayer and sang, *There's Something About That Name*.



During the business session the Credentials Committee made a motion to accept Gracia Y Verdad (Grace & Truth) into the membership of the Association. A motion was also made to dismiss Rios de Agua Viva (Rivers of Living Water) from membership to unite with the East

Tennessee Association in Newport. The Budget Proposal and Nominations Committee Report for 2023-24 were adopted. Rev. Brian Rhodes was elected to serve as moderator and Rev. Shane Pierce will serve as Assistant Moderator.



Local ministry directors shared reports from their ministries. **Rev. William Burton**, representing the Tennessee Baptist Mission Board, presented a plaque to **Rev. David Hawkins** for the Golden Offering receipts from Nolachucky churches.

The meeting ended with the passing of the gavel from **Rev. Charlie Brewer** to **Rev. Brian Rhodes** who then led in the closing prayer.
