



The 197th Annual Meeting of the Nolachucky Baptist Association

The 197th Annual Meeting of the Nolachucky Baptist Association was held on Tuesday, October 15 at Hillcrest Baptist Church, Morristown. Thank you, Hillcrest for being so welcoming! Attending the meeting were 221 registered messengers and guests from 39 churches. There were 25 pastors in attendance.



Lee Allen Dalton led the worship with beautiful songs from the choir and the congregation. Special music was presented by the praise team along with a solo from Lee Allen.

Rev. Dannie Bell brought the message from Ephesians 4:1-6 entitled "Unity". Bro. Dannie reminded us that the scriptures are the written instructions for us. Bro. Dannie pointed out the seven "ones'

mentioned in the verses; one body, one Spirit, one **hope**, one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and Father. He told us that we must respect the house of God and unite together. He reminded us that our **hope** is Jesus Christ.



During the business session the Credentials Committee made a motion to accept Children of Christ Baptist Church (Micronesians) into the membership of the Association. A motion was also made to dismiss International Fellowship from the Association's Watchcare in order to return to a ministry status. A motion was also made to dismiss Lakeshore Road Baptist Church from the Association's Membership. The church has entered a dissolution process and is no longer meeting. The Budget Proposal and Nominations Committee Report for 2024-25 were adopted. Rev. Scott Ingram was elected to serve as moderator and Rev. Travis Webb will serve as assistant moderator.



Local ministry directors shared reports from their ministries. **Rev. William Burton**, representing the Tennessee Baptist Mission Board, thanked the churches for supporting the cooperative program and gave an update on some Hispanic families affected by the recent floods. **Rev. Gene Nelson**, Harvest Field 6 representative, presented a plaque to **Rev. David Hawkins** for the Golden Offering receipts from Nolachucky churches which was #2 in the state.

The meeting ended with the passing of the gavel from **Rev. Brian Rhodes** to **Rev. Scott Ingram** who then led in the closing prayer.
